Over 40 owners and employees of NARI member companies and guests got an introduction to green remodeling at the March dinner meeting of Miami Valley NARI. Guest speakers Gary Demos, CR, CKD, LEED AP, CAPS, and Ali Smith, AKBD, LEED AP, Allied ASID, from Dave Fox Remodeling, Columbus, discussed some of the basic principles of green and sustainable construction. Dave Fox Remodeling is a member of NARI of Central Ohio.

Suggestions they made for remodelers who want to join the green construction movement included:

Recycling — Place recycling bins in your office and shop, donate used cabinets and appliances (think McMRF), recycle construction waste when possible.

Indoor air quality — Use low VOC products, provide proper ventilation.

Energy efficiency — Install highefficiency insulation, specify highefficiency HVAC equipment, use effective air sealing techniques.

April lunch meeting will focus on "Hot Trends"

The Miami Valley NARI lunch meeting on Tuesday, April 24, will feature a return of one of the most popular program subjects for chapter meetings—a series of presentations focusing on trends that affect the remodeling industry, followed by an open forum discussion and question and answer session. I personally believe with all of the positive publicity our chapter is generating, the public awareness of who is NARI should help us hit 160 members by the end of the year.
