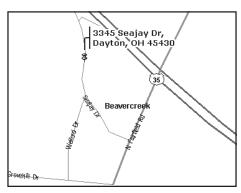

Green Building moves more into mainstream

Rising energy prices are prompting more and more U.S. home owners to consider green building, which involves the use of recycled materials, non-toxic products and energy-efficient features, according to a June 27 article in *The Baltimore Sun*.

Sub-flooring made from recycled newspapers, straw bale walls, bathroom tile made from recycled automobile windshields, and bamboo floors are examples of eco-friendly features. Home owners also can opt for energy-efficient appliances, solar panels, solar water systems, roofs covered in grass and other vegetation, and radiant floor heating; but many balk at the upfront costs involved.

Green materials can cost more than traditional products, but builders say the expense is offset by longterm energy savings. More affordable green materials include paints and carpeting without volatile organic compounds, cellulose insulation and reflective roofs.

Some home owners report difficulty in locating builders and remodelers willing to undertake green projects because of the higher costs, but the industry is being driven by the LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) standard and should get another boost when NAHB issues its national green-building guidelines later this year.

Remodeling demand leads to night work

The Wall Street Journal (July 16 edition) reports that home owners are expected to spend 5% more on remodeling projects this year than they did in 2003, hitting \$224 billion by the end of this year. That's the good news. The bad news is that remodelers don't have time to do all the work.

Skyrocketing property prices have made remodeling even more popular as a growing number of home owners choose to stay put. As a result, in many areas contractors are in such high demand that many clients are willing to pay double to have work done after normal business hours, either starting before dawn or lasting well into the night. Off-hours construction could violate local noise ordinances or home owners association rules.

Violations could come with fines or even jail time, but lax enforcement in many locales has allowed the practice to continue. While neighbors in some areas file noise complaints, contractors say most keep to themselves because next month they may want to start an after-hours remodeling project!

Kitchen & bath certification class starts September 8

NARI members in southwest Ohio will have their first close-to-home opportunity to attend NARI Certified Kitchen and Bath Remodeler (CKBR) study sessions and take the certification examination this fall.

A ten week preparation class will start on Wednesday, September 8, and continue through Wednesday, November 10. The certification examination will be on Saturday, November 13. All class sessions will be held from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the NARI Office, 136 South Keowee Street, Dayton.

The three hour study sessions will be led by Kip Bohachek, CR, one of the most experienced NARI certification trainers in the country. Kip has conducted certification training for NARI members in southwest Ohio for over a decade. His dedication to the certification program is one of the reasons Miami Valley NARI has the

try. The only candidates who have not successfully achieved certification under Kip's leadership are a few who had to drop out due to health problems or family emergencies.

The CKBR designation documents the remodeler's knowledge, technical expertise, and practical skill in kitchen & bath remodeling. The program covers such subjects as Computer Aided Design (CAD), materials selection, layout standards, installations processes, and trade guidelines.

Demand for kitchen & bath remodels is growing and both continue to be the most popular rooms in the home to remodel. The CKBR program offers remodelers the opportu-

nity to become certified professionals in this important specialty area.

The program is open to individuals who have been working in the remodeling field for a minimum of five consecutive years. CKBR candidates must complete a qualification form, which outlines their educational background and practical experience in remodeling. Each class participant will receive a study guide and a business management book.

The total cost of the program for individuals who own or are employed by NARI member companies is \$580, which includes the application fee, the examination fee, and the study group fee. The total cost to nonmembers is \$915. Applications, with the application fee of \$385, are due at the NARI office by August 10.

Three members of Ohio Valley NARI have already enrolled in the program. NARI members from the Dayton area who want to join their Cincinnati neighbors in seeking this newest NARI professional certification should submit their applications as soon as possible.
